Topic: Youth, Disarmament and Non-Proliferation

Expressing appreciation for the progress youth have made in the fields of disarmament and non-proliferation.

The Effects of Nuclear Weapons and How to Deal With Them

1. Calls for the safe disposal of nuclear waste;

International Cooperation to Promote Disarmament

2. Urges all nations to continue signing and ratifying disarmament and non proliferation treaties including TPNW and future policies;
3. Strongly encourages nations to reduce the production of all weapons of mass destruction;

4. Encourages the UN to take decisive action on registering nuclear weapons;
5. Further requests member states to allow NGOs to monitor weapon production;
6. Implores nations to regulate the distribution of firearms;

Youth Involvement and Awareness in Disarmament and Non-Proliferation Efforts

7. Advises youth to learn about the effect nuclear weapons have on our society;
8. Encourages youth to raise effort in preventing the manufacturing of nuclear weapons;
9. Calls upon the youth and the UN to promote the creation of more nuclear free zones;
10. Suggests that youth use the arts and other forms of media to support disarmament;
11. Further invites youth to organize peaceful protests and petitions, and write letters to raise awareness about the danger of nuclear weapons;

Changing the Use of Nuclear Weapons and Energy Using Worldwide Collaboration

12. Strongly recommends the passing of laws to allow and encourage the safe repurposing of nuclear weapons in civilian applications.
