Topic: Impact of the Ukraine-Russia conflict on global food security and related matters

Recognizing that the Russia-Ukraine conflict is affecting food production and security worldwide,

Noting the speed of food production has slowed since the start of the war,

Having considered starting treaties and agreements,

Acknowledging sanctions that have already been placed,

Deeply concerned that with the current conflict in Ukraine and Russia, accomplishing the 17 SDGs (sustainable development goals) is impossible,

Affirming that the UN should find a way to transport local food to developing countries to limit the food insecurity,

Desiring higher education in agriculture for less developed countries,

Noting with regret the lack of the supplies less developed countries have to expand agriculturally,

Treaties, Agreements, and Funds

1. Requests to increase funds for all agricultural projects;
2. Emphasizes the role of government voices;
3. Calls for conventions that separate war from trade;
4. Notes that we should create food security programs;

Increase of Safety and Efficiency in Food Production

5. Affirms that in order to keep crops safe from the war, alternative farming locations will be established;
6. Encourages speeding up crop production and exports;
7. Urges the lowering of food waste;
8. Draws the attention to keeping food related diseases under control;
9. Strongly encourages first world countries to aid struggling countries in lowering carbon footprint and raising food supply;

Imports and Exports

10. Calls upon the UN to set up an organization with the purpose of helping countries Import and Export to neighboring countries by lowering transport fees;
11. Acknowledges the commodity shock caused by the Russian-Ukraine conflict, and acknowledge that the UN should place emergency procedures to help with the blocked food supply;

12. Takes note the fact that over 205 million people are affected by food insecurity, with the suggestion that countries want to find food within their borders, reducing dependence on other developing countries or countries in conflict;

13. Recommends keeping trading grounds safe and out of wars;

Increasing Efforts in Agriculture for Countries

14. Requests aid from larger countries to establish a foundation of agriculture independence;

15. Encourages the use of the greenhouses to accommodate countries that do not have the climate necessary to grow grain and other necessary food that countries lack;

16. Draws attention to the fact that an increase in agriculture will lead to an increase in Job opportunities which will help stabilize the economy.
