Topic: Convention on Biological Diversity

Alarmed by the fact that in 2020 alone, 25.8 million hectares of the world's forests were cut down,

Recognizing the fact people are using more plastic than necessary,

Recognizing that we should reduce the production of plastic,

Deeply concerned that all generations are not fully aware of the loss of biodiversity that the world is facing,

Taking into account that funding is difficult in developing countries as they are not as developed as other countries and cannot fund their schools,

Recognizing that our world uses too many fossil fuels,

Emphasizing the need for countries to use alternative energy sources,

Habitats and Animals

- 1. Strongly encourages member states to share resources equally and safely throughout countries if they can;
- 2. Calls upon member states to use non-native bamboo instead of wood;
- 3. Advises member states to create national parks to promote biodiversity;
- 4. Requests member states to penalize people from harming heavily biodiverse areas;
- 5. Endorses the signing of treaties to protect shipments from biodiverse areas;
- 6. Expresses its hope that countries rebuild bio-friendly habitats;

Effects of Human Activity

- 7. Encourages the reduction of man-made materials;
- 8. Calls upon member states to help raise awareness on poaching;
- 9. Calls upon background checks before giving hunting license;
- 10. Requests that people stop wasting man-made materials;
- II. Supports the reduction of illegal hunting;
- 12. Requests for a substitute for plastic;

Education

- 13. Requests schools to adopt and utilize classes, programs, and clubs;
- 14. Further requests that funding from COPI5 and 26 fund the classes and school programs;
- 15. Recommends that communities support biodiversity by community gardens and greenhouses;
- 16. Encourages that schools take field trips to biodiversity museums, zoos, and centers;

Use of Energy

- 17. Encourages countries to reduce the use of fossil fuels;
- 18. Requests countries to increase opportunities for their people to use public transportation;
- 19. Recommends countries to start recycling and reusing energy;
- 20. Reminds countries to be mindful of overusing energy;
- 21. Encourages countries to stop unnecessary use of energy;
- 22. Strongly advises all countries to educate their citizens about the use of energy and encouraging communities to get involved.
