Topic: Culture of Peace

Approving Past Documents that support equalities such as the UDHR, but keeping in mind that the UDHR has not been factored into the school system since its creation in 1948,

Expressing satisfaction at the movements against racial discrimination,

Approving the teaching of all historical events to ensure that history does not repeat itself,

Emphasizing the fact that many rural areas depend on others to fund their peace education,

Deeply concerned about the lack of safety around the world,

Recognizing the importance of disarmament,

Approving of the actions taken by many countries towards peace,

Taking into account the massive amount of crime in many areas,

Safety

1. Calls upon member states to stop mass production of nuclear weapons;
2. Urges countries to create more safety measures to prevent terrorism;
3. Instructs more countries to take measures against hate speech in a nonviolent way;
4. Draws attention to the need for safety to create peace;

The Benefit of Building Peace

5. Further recommends individual to research how a culture of peace would benefit their community greatly;
6. Emphasizes the importance of government cooperation;
7. Encourages funding of peacekeeping missions;
8. Demands conflict resolution through peaceful dialogue and mediation;
9. Reminds countries that peace can create democracy;
10. Acknowledges the need for sustainable development to achieve peace;
11. Declares that peace could prevent war and destruction;
12. Reminds member states that peace can create better ecosystems;

Equality

13. Calls for countries to promote freedom of speech;
14. Emphasizes the need for governments to invest additional funds into lower income jobs;
15. Appreciates the importance of global retirement funds organization being established;
16. Draws attention to the need for a UN program that works to create equality;

Building Peace through Education

17. Urges schools to educate the youth about stereotypes including race, gender, class, age, and their repercussions which helps build a culture of peace;
18. Recommends that countries create programs to educate the public about gender and class inequality;
19. Emphasizes the need for additional mandatory peace promoting classes for youth;
20. Stresses the importance of peace education for law enforcement.
