5. Calls upon countries of the world to help least developed countries to build agricultural infrastructure;

6. Urges the use of recycled materials to build underground safe houses to protect food;
7. Encourages the use of open land and recycled materials to build homeless shelters, greenhouses, community gardens, and hospitals as related issues as a result of the war in Ukraine;
8. Invites volunteers to help with the construction of these homeless shelters, hospitals and agricultural safe houses;
9. Further recommends fundraising in support of these projects;
