Topic: Impact of the Ukraine-Russia conflict on global food security and related matters

Noting with deep concern, because of the conflict in Ukraine, food exports have been drastically limited, and food prices have skyrocketed,

Realizing that food is decreasing and people are undernourished, there are thousands dying everyday due to food insecurity,

Bearing in mind that Ukraine and Russia account for one-third of the worlds wheat supply,

Alarmed by the fact that land is being destroyed,

Deeply concerned about the low wages of farmers,

Keeping in mind how hunger is affecting the world,

Further recalling how using pesticides have been killing pollinators,

Agriculture

1. Calls for diverse, fast growing nutritional crops that can grow year round and in many different climates;
2. Advises using new farming technology to help farmers such as evaporation filters;
3. Considers using vertical farms, floating farms, and rooftop farms;
4. Strongly encourages using better soil, as well as good crop rotations, taking advantage of natural resources and composting;
5. Also urges using renewable products from eco-friendly factories;
6. Emphasizes promoting farming and raising farmers wages;

Imports, Exports, and Prices

7. Strongly advises Russia to allow Ukraine to export agricultural products;
8. Urges wealthy countries to provide aid to food insecure countries;
9. Invites countries to collaborate with each other to import and export more agricultural products;
10. Suggests countries to export fertilizers and energy to Ukraine;
11. Emphasizes the need for food prices to lower so more people do not fall into poverty;
12. Recommends countries to invest in actions to enrich soil;

Poverty among Farmers and Families and People's Rights

13. Encourages countries and families to compost more;
14. Emphasizes buying farming crops or donating to farmers;

15. Advises countries to help out one another to grow crops;

Farming and Related Matters

16. Requests that materials be delivered to farmers who need them;

17. Considers increasing the wages of families based on how many children they have;

18. Invites volunteers to distribute food and supplies to countries in need, especially in rural areas;

19. Encourages volunteer work to raise awareness about the issue;

20. Advises people to participate in agricultural lessons and virtual classes that teach people that want to get into farming how to grow, maintain, and harvest crops;

21. Strongly encourages growing more community gardens;

22. Calls upon countries to use less pesticides.
