### **Topic: Adequate Housing**

Alarmed by the amount of citizens that do not have a sustainable way of living and taking into consideration the success of past housing experiments such as the housing experiment in Belgium, proving that achieving adequate housing is not impossible,

Deeply disturbed by the CoronaVirus's effects, observing how important jobs and adequate housing are - so many people need homes that we would need to build 96,000 homes a day until 2030 to house the 3 billion people that need them,

Realizing the numerous amounts of people living in inadequate housing and the alarming rates of people experiencing homelessness,

Fully alarmed by the amount of trash collecting on our planet,

#### Funding and Donations to Help Housing

- 1. Encourages raising funds via social media platforms and billboards;
- 2. Urges governments to change minimum wage in accordance to house costs;
- Recommends the creation of organizations that can fund or help raise money to fund homeless shelters and education programs and housing;
- 4. Recognizes the effects that inadequate housing has on the world and therefore this global problem will require global cooperation to solve;
- 5. Urges for homeless shelters and organizations to have mobile services consisting of volunteers from their community to transfer homeless people to the shelter, as many people are not able to walk to the shelters;

## **Construction of Housing**

- 6. Recommends the use of tiny homes and shipping containers;
- 7. Supports the idea of using property taxes to put into housing projects;
- 8. Encourages the use of housing repair kits;
- 9. Endorses the idea of tiny homes as a sustainable solution, recognizing that tiny homes require less workers, time, and materials than larger houses;
- 10. Adopts the idea of sustainable housing in the form of hobbit holes;

#### **Sustainable Housing**

- 11. Urges the usage of shipping containers and yurts to create new homes;
- 12. Requests the development of sustainable 3D printed homes;
- 13. Welcomes the refurbishing of abandoned homes;

- 14. Considers creating homes that work with the natural environment;
- 15. Emphasizes the use of trash and recyclable materials to create sustainable housing globally;

## **Job Opportunities for the Homeless**

- 16. Advises the funds from the organizations to be used for sustainable materials such as ecobricks;
- 17. Calls for the creation of programs to educate people on adequate housing
- 18. Introduces the notion of a stipend to help people with low-incomes buy their first house (the funds come from the organization).
