Topic: Rights of the Child

Alarmed by the fact that because of sexuality, race, ethnicity, and religions, many children are being discriminated against,

Deeply concerned that young girls around the world are forced to get married not being able to continue their education,

Aware of the sheer amount of children with loss of education,

Noting with deep concern that children suffer from malnutrition and abuse everyday,

Concerned about children's mental health during depression and anxiety,

Hunger and Education, Discrimination, Malnutrition

- Encourages governments to create laws and policies regarding forced marriage and child marriage;
- 2. Urges member states to create educational programs about the effects of malnutrition;
- 3. Advises the establishment of immediate education for refugee children;
- 4. Recommends that schools have food drives and food banks because it allows families to provide food for their children;

- 5. Strongly advises free, local, and mandated education for children in poorer countries and rural areas;
- 6. Expresses its hope that people will create community gardens and compost to decrease food waste and for community purposes;

Child Labor, Safety and Protection, Transportation Issues, Child Trafficking

- 7. Requests that funding towards better transportation in rural areas so that more children can access adequate education;
- 8. Encourages government support programs for families considering child labor or child trafficking;

Physical Wellbeing, Malnutrition, Child Abuse and Neglect

- 9. Strongly expresses its hope that people will/can use and establish NGOs that provide therapy free of charge to children that need and can't afford therapy;
- 10. Endorses NGOs that provide food and drinking water for children without families;

Mental Health, General Wellbeing

- 11. Encourages countries to give children the medical care they need;
- 12. Emphasizes the reason to lower the price of healthcare so all can access good medical care and counseling for struggling children.
