Topic: Youth, Disarmament and Non-Proliferation

Bearing in mind the potential destruction and power brought by the use of nuclear, chemical and biological weapons,

Realizing the production of nuclear weapons could have effects on other countries,

Noting with regret that the Russian-Ukrainian war could end up in World War 3,

Having considered that using nuclear power has resulted in many deaths,

Recognizing the impact and vital role that youth play in disarmament and non-proliferation,

Fully aware of the crucial role of education in promoting sustainable development,

Disarmament of Nuclear Weapons and Weapons in the World

1. Affirms the importance of the ban on most nuclear weapons;
2. Calls upon more developed nations and the UN security council to help teach and provide supplies to less developed nations;
3. Accepts the use of nuclear reactors to produce electricity;
4. Requests that we ban the production of weapons;

5. Emphasizes that nuclear terrorism has been a big problem for a long time;
6. Draws the attention to other countries the nuclear power that Russia has;
7. Reminds countries to stop using nuclear power;

Global Education

8. Encourages education that promotes cross-country understanding and global citizenship;
9. Promotes social inclusion;
10. Calls on international organizations and institutions to prioritize global education;
11. Emphasizes the need to support and amplify the voices of young leaders who advocate for a world free from nuclear weapons;
12. Recommends the idea of school programs or creative extracurriculars to promote disarmament;
13. Considers an app to alarm individuals of identity fraud;
14. Further invites the creation of extra school activities for people who want them.

Global Security

15. Encourages member states to develop and implement national strategies to prevent the proliferation of chemical and biological weapons;
16. Welcomes countries to establish more security for toxic weapons;
17. Further recommends countries to join conventions to ban the use of chemical and biological weapons;

18. Endorses strict international regulations and treaties to prevent the production, stockpiling and the use of chemical and toxic weapons;
19. Affirms the ban of chemical, toxic and biological weapons;
20. Emphasizes the importance of transparency and accountability in reporting instance of chemical and toxic use or possession;
21. Condemns the use of chemical and toxic weapons and supports the investments in technology research and development to enhance detection and protection;
22. Encourages educating youth on safety of handling the chemical weapons to avoid danger to the society;

The Use of Technology

23. Supports the use of biometrics;
24. Recommends using different types of biometrics;
25. Encourages IT support;
26. Calls upon more developed countries to help provide the necessary infrastructure to help promote better access to technology;
27. Endorses the production of peaceful technology.
