**Topic: Culture of Peace** 

Believing that peace education would prevent a lot of conflicts,

Alarmed by the number of people who will not embrace this action,

Affirming to make school programmes so that children can learn about the different cultures that live in the same country,

Emphasizing the fact that we should teach people self defense in case of violent emergencies,

Noting with deep concern about the amount of ammunition in the world,

Aware of the destruction and ammunition that can harm humanity,

Fully alarmed by the amount of violence in the world,

Deeply concerned about the amount of corruption happening especially in people with power,

Bearing in mind that inflation can cause corruption, which can lead to conflict,

Fully aware that if we do not take action soon, basic foundation will crumble and it will be harder to achieve a culture of peace,

Reminding developed countries that they cannot exploit undeveloped countries for their benefits.

Acknowledging that countries trust the government but if the government fails to bring basic needs and resources the people will be mad and there will be no peace,

Noting with regret that some countries' governments might not want fair trade or trade at all,

Fully aware of the violation of human rights happening in many countries that leads to violence,

Noting with regret of the poor intercontinental relationships throughout the world,

Fully alarmed by the problems of coexistence between different cultures that lead to conflict,

#### **Peace Education**

- 1. Recommends to give people good education to promote world peace;
- 2. Encourages people to use social media in order to educate peace;
- 3. Reminds everybody how peace education is important;
- 4. Considers the collaboration of developed countries and developing countries to promote peace;
- 5. Encourages people to live life through a model of non-violence, as well as educating others on it as well;
- 6. Strongly condemns the discrimination against developing countries;
- 7. Strongly encourages the disarmament of weapons of mass destruction;
- 8. Requests for there to be an education programme not just for children about how we can achieve a culture of peace;

### Prevention of War and Destruction

- 9. Encourages countries to lessen the production of firearms and ammunition;
- 10. Considers that firearms and ammunitions are only given to officers to protect citizens;
- 11. Recommends that firearms are not to be sold at stores and gun shops;
- 12. Calls upon countries to prevent conflict and war;
- 13. Requests countries to avoid violence;
- 14. Encourages countries to set up transparency programs to help abolish corruption;

### **Prevention of Conflicts in Trading**

- 15. Recognises that if we have inflation in any country, there will be more protests and have less peace;
- 16. Emphasizes how important basic needs are, like proper healthcare, in achieving a culture of peace;
- 17. Emphasizes that availability of resources for everyone is very important to achieve a balanced society;
- 18. Expresses its hope that everyone should have access to basic needs and proper healthcare;
- 19. Draws to the attention that reducing plastic waste is helpful to keeping a culture of peace;
- 20. Encourages world leaders to promote free trade, human rights, security and privacy, proper healthcare and other things needed for a culture of peace;
- 21. Draws the attention to how important human rights are in a culture of peace;

- 22. Acknowledges that human rights and basic needs are important to gain a culture of peace;
- 23. Strongly encourages world leaders to realize how important this topic is not just for their country but for the world as a global community.
- 24. Recognises that world leaders need to help everyone to have access to healthcare and basic needs:
- 25. Emphasizes that exploiting undeveloped countries will lead to conflict;

# **Human Rights in Solution**

- 26. Strongly encourages to penalize all countries that violate human rights;
- 27. Expresses its hope for better intercontinental relationships through a stronger global community established by world leaders working together on international problems;
- 28. Emphasizes the need for cultural diversity throughout different countries;
- 29. Encourages countries to make campaigns to show people the importance of cultural diversity;
- 30. Encourages nations to build mutual trust with other countries by establishing dialogue as well as a network for a global community;
- 31. Reminds us of the importance of working together to achieve equality for all people;
- 32. Reminds that all people have a voice and vote, and that they must be respected.
