Topic: Adequate Housing

Alarmed by the increasing amount of poverty in the world, we will do everything in our power to protect everyone in the world, especially the poor people,

Recognizing that people have the right to shelter,

Noting with regret that migrants and refugees are not always welcome in the country where they are moving to,

Fully aware that people need a home because it involves a major part of their lives and because it will keep people secure from the elements, keep them healthy, provide safety, as well as build neighborhoods with schools, jobs, and hospitals,

Bearing in mind that poverty is increasing daily, people will not have adequate houses they will not have enough resources to get the adequate house,

Fully alarmed by armed conflicts, this issue may cause living spaces to be unsafe for others to inhabit and cause harm to those living there affecting adequate housing as these make homes no longer inhabitable,

Due to the lack of resources, houses cannot be constructed properly which can cause issues to the person who lives inside the house

Noting with deep concern that 2 million people are forcibly evicted from their homes every year,

Taking into account that there are countries that don't have regular temperature in their houses because of the lack of gas due to the war between Ukraine and Russia,

What people with disabilities, women, and children are facing

1. Encourages gender balance and we will make sure that it stays balanced all around the world as without gender balance, discrimination would be caused and adequate housing would not be accessible to all;
2. Further reminds countries to increase security and protection in apartments and communities;
3. Encourages the use of mobile units to inform women of their rights and this would allow citizens to find work and freedom;
4. Further requests countries with slums (unhygienic places/houses) to build more houses to accommodate more people in houses;
5. Reminds countries to decrease housing prices as some people can not afford expensive/adequate houses, while maintaining the salaries of the people who build them;
6. Encourages the creation of special programs to create special equipment or services to help people in need;
7. Trusts the UN and developed countries to come and help other countries to fulfill adequate housing with their people;

8. Encourages member states to provide more jobs that have to do with high-quality housing construction;
9. Calls upon the government to use a portion of tax money to rebuild houses ruined in natural disasters;

10. Requests the countries that don't already provide free healthcare to do it so that people could pay for housing instead of spending so much on healthcare;
11. Recommends for the government to build community buildings for people to live in so that it is easier for them to find a job;
12. Endorses constructing apartments instead of houses so that the government can afford housing for homeless people, migrants, and refugees;
13. Encourages that the materials used for construction should be environmentally-friendly;

Threats to adequate housing/ Environment resources

14. Recommends governments to provide houses as poverty is one of the reason can come up with policies and schemes to help constructing houses for poor people
15. Encourages the countries to build house with materials which can cause less damage during natural disasters
16. Further recommends governments should take care of that adequate housing should not occupy more agriculture lands
17. Recommends further affordable finance to allow more people to qualify for a mortgage and buy a house and also provide lower housing rental;
18. Encourages to stop building houses next to sea volcanoes, all places where there could be the kinds of natural disasters;
19. Further reminds people who lives in boats, urban and rural areas need to take care of nature so that ozone layer cannot affect and adequate housing possibility percentage can be increased;

20. Recommends to make more houses out of stronger material for extreme conditions;

Resources, finance, and laws

21. Reminds richer countries to collaborate with NGOs to provide adequate housing for people;

22. Further requests that member states create policies to a specific limit of rent and reduce the number of illegal forced evictions;

23. Encourages laws to limit the increasing of prices of houses maintaining their quality;

24. Recommends that countries use stronger and sustainable building materials to build houses as unsturdy houses can be dangerous;

25. Encourages the creation of a fund where banks lend some money to developing countries to finance the building of low-priced housing;

26. Further recommends the creation of an association that would recover the furniture of old houses to repair it and then sell it at low prices for people in inadequate housing situations.
