



## Resolution GA/1/1.1

### General Assembly First Committee

### Topic: Reducing space threats through norms, rules and principles of responsible behaviors

Bearing in mind the fact that all countries are impacted by actions in space including the potential threats caused by space debris and other unregistered objects in orbit,

Emphasizing concern about potential dangers space debris poses to our future,

Recognizing the need for cooperation and transparency between programs regarding space affairs,

Keeping in mind the possibility of militarization and nuclearization of space,

Fully aware that space has a wide variety of resources and must be used responsibly,

Noting that various nations abuse their access to space,

Alarmed by the potential threat of destructive debris,

Aware of the planned presence of nuclear weapons in space,

Observing the use of commercial satellites for military purposes,

### Managing Space Objects

- I. Urges every nation to monitor and register all current and future objects in space;

2. Strongly encourages transparency between all space programs and nations;
3. Calls upon the removal of space debris such as out of commission rockets, satellites and rovers;

### **International Partnerships and Treaties**

4. Requests the creation of an international space agency that standardized norms, rules, and principles in space;
5. Supports the implementation of the Space Harmony Agreement;
6. Recommends the creation of a treaty for the de-weaponization of space;
7. Emphasizes the need for partnerships to remove space debris;

### **The Use of Weapons Regarding Space**

8. Insists the implementation of trackers into objects sent into space, to assist with the cleaning or repurposing of the machinery;
9. Recommends a revision of the Outer Space Treaty to add a new section prioritizing denuclearization of space;
10. Advises for supervision and strict regulations against the use of commercial satellites for the military purposes;

### **Respecting Space and all the Resources it Provides**

11. Suggests that countries should collaborate to make space more accessible in order to decrease militarization in space;
12. Introduces the ideas of communications between nations on the topic of respecting space and its resources.
