Topic: Disaster Risk Reduction

Realizing the potential damages and long-term effects that disasters can bring,

Emphasizing the need for communication and media briefing,

Noting with deep concern that there is not enough education on disasters,

Alarmed by the amount of countries neglecting the importance of disaster education,

Keeping in mind the difficulty of applying funds to DRR programs,

Education on Disasters

1. Acknowledges the need for financial assistance by having summits by member states;
2. Suggests countries to financially invest in bio-education policies;
3. Stresses the importance of education on global cooperation during a disaster;

Natural Disasters Overall

4. Reaffirms the importance of strengthening infrastructure by exporting materials for reinforcement;
5. Calls for efficient early warning systems by enhancing communication budget for national alertness;

Prevention and Prediction Measures

6. Adopts the research for preventative technology and breakthroughs in DRR from financially stable countries to reduce the need of funding for research from economically needy nations;
7. Encourages the need of protection for people in poverty by including safe shelters;
8. Expresses its hope for effective evacuation routes and safety precautions;
9. Calls upon global observations of possible signs of oncoming disasters;

Funding

10. Advises member states to utilize skillful services under an emergency budget;
11. Calls upon the redirecting of taxes to fund DRR programs.
