### Topic: Disaster Risk Reduction

Deeply concerned by the fact that there are so many natural disasters in the world, yet so many people do not know that they are happening,

Alarmed by the lack of protection from natural disasters that the homeless and disabled people have,

Bearing in mind that help from satellites can detect natural disasters and activate sirens,

Confident that educating people on this matter is key to the safety of many people,

Bearing in mind that international cooperation and education for the youth may be necessary to ensure that these disasters become less dangerous,

Deeply concerned about the aftermath of natural disasters,

### Early Warning Systems for Disasters

1. Encourages member states to construct weatherproof shelters and homes with the use of cheaper and more sustainable resources;
2. Endorses supplying accessible alarms applicable to a person's disability;

3. Calls upon the inclusion of an application on all phones that notifies people of natural disasters nearby;

### **Global Impact of Disasters**

4. Endorses recycling debris collected after natural disasters to rebuild communities;
5. Urges the gathering of funds from high-earning corporations to aid people and families affected by natural disasters;
6. Suggests that countries have people whose job is to direct disabled people to emergency exits in case of natural or man-made disasters;

### **Implementation of Recovery Tactics after Disasters**

7. Calls upon countries to potentially create rescue teams to protect people affected by natural disasters, relocating them to nearby shelters with doctors to provide medical help;
8. Urges member states to donate to a charity run by the UN to help less wealthy countries recover from natural disasters;
9. Instructs operation centers to help people recover from natural disasters;
10. Recommends the development of safe shelters for families and people who have lost their homes to natural disasters;

### **Food Preparation Systems**

11. Advises nations to help farmers after natural disasters;
12. Calls for action towards protecting crops;
13. Encourage making more farms
  - a. Also recommends opening more food markets;
14. Calls upon nations to develop more emergency food cabinets;
15. Endorses seeking flood water and filtering it for potable water;
16. Recommends farmers to grow food on different land levels.
