### Topic: Disaster Risk Reduction

Alarmed by how people are suffering poverty,

Fully alarmed by the amount of people being greatly affected by disasters and hazards around the world, especially LLDC's,

Deeply concerned by the lack of education for youth regarding disaster risk,

Noting that some countries can't invest in early warning systems, causing the lack of adequate responses to the horrendous effects from disasters and hazards,

Recognizing the need for hospitals food and water,

Expresses regrets about the lack of funding towards infrastructure,

Aware of the amount of the people facing poverty,

Realizing that earthquakes and floodings cause buildings to fall down,

### **Infrastructure Funding**

1. Recommends to create a fund to improve infrastructure;
2. Endorses other countries to reduce greenhouse gasses;
3. Trusts that high GDP countries will fund low ones;
4. Believes in international cooperation to reduce the dangers of disasters;

### **Disaster Preparedness**

5. Calls upon the use of early warning systems;
6. Affirms that higher GDP countries fund lower GDP countries;
7. Encourages countries to create online programs for disaster preparedness;
8. Convincing people to take appropriate action to prevent disaster damage;

### **Control of Risk Caused by Climate Change**

9. Considers creating worldwide foundations for people affected by disasters;
10. Encourages more food and clothing drives around the cities and towns;
11. Strongly advises building suitable housing for families;
12. Recommends making billboards around cities so that people are aware of the situation;

### **Education and Communication**

13. Expresses its appreciation for countries who are focusing and taking action on disaster, risk, and reduction;
14. Emphasizes countries that are suffering from disaster risk and calls upon member states to assist;
15. Supports NGOs that help people suffering from disasters and hazards;
16. Declares funding system for stronger infrastructure.
