Spreading Awareness using technology

- I. Considers that billboards for food will produce proper advertisements;
- 2. Calls upon member states to implement robotic farming technology;
- 3. Encourages developers to make games and videos about food insecurity;
- 4. Considers that youth programs could give summer and part-time jobs in the food system industries;
- 5. Calls upon member states and organizations to educate youth on agricultural farming;
- 6. Requests teachers to inform youth about food insecurity;

Educational programs for educational farming

- 7. Encourages money to be donated to help school fund educational farming;
- 8. Requests donations from other countries to give them proper equipment;
- 9. Endorses to design laws to prevent the lack of food on countries;
- 10. Calls upon to have activities to teach the children about farming;
- II. Authorizes to donate money to empty spaces of land to build more greenhouses for students to learn;
- 12. Recommends to hold camps about farming to inspire youth to farm;

Transportation of agriculture and food

- 13. Strongly encourages the concept of farming;
- 14. Requests to build greenhouses in order to grow and protect crops;
- 15. Requests people to send food and money to poor countries;

Easier ways to grow and sustain food

- 16. Encourages farmers to grow an economically stable food system;
- 17. Encourages member states to invest in food and agriculture transport systems;
- 18. Strongly requests that organizations that work in agriculture and food security join a bigger and complete organization so a network or materials can be spread.
