Topic: SOCHUM/Human rights questions, including alternative approaches for improving the effective enjoyment of human rights and fundamental freedoms - the right to privacy in the digital age

This article is about the interviews I had at Topic 2: SOCHUM. During the subtopic discussion, I interviewed four delegates and a chair member about their countries' opinions on the topics and the committee session in general. Emilia, a 7th grader representing the Maldives, said she is surprised that her country is making alliances with other countries.
