**Topic: Promoting international cooperation on peaceful uses in the context of international security**

Taking into consideration the importance of regulating destructive weaponry,

Alarmed by the extensive growth of harmful AI usage,

Fully aware that the international community is not taking the steps needed to lower cybercrimes,

Recognizing the civilian toll due to armed conflicts,

Noting that due to different views between states, civilian needs have become so vast that it is very difficult to provide humanitarian aid,

Alarmed by the amount of conflicts globally,

### Cyber Threats

1. Requests the education systems to teach students about cyber threats;
2. Emphasizes that member states should improve the cyber defenses of their civilians;

### Suppression Of Destructive Weaponry

3. Strongly advises states to secure and eventually dismantle their nuclear weaponry;
4. Calls upon nations to raise awareness about destructive weaponry;
5. Notes with deep concern the effects destructive weapons have on the environment;

### **Maintaining International Peace**

6. Calls upon third party states and international organizations to promote ceasefires and settle armed conflicts for the sake of civilian lives;
7. Strongly suggests the use of drones in a peaceful manner;
8. Reminds countries to prohibit dangerous usage of nonhuman actions/items;

### **Prevention Of Death Of Civilians In Conflict**

9. Calls upon developed nations to support and fund developing nations relating to civilian aid;
10. Strongly encourages member states to distribute humanitarian aid to civilians in need whenever possible;
11. Calls for reducing the humanitarian impact of sanctions on citizens.
