### Water Sustainability

- I. Emphasizes the need to conserve and save water through sand filters;
- 2. Calls upon nations to export food and water to countries suffering from droughts;
- 3. Encourages able countries to use more renewable energy sources; and import local food and water;

### **Maintaining Ecosystems**

4. Calls for government to take action and maintain local ecosystems;

- 5. Invites informed citizens, governments, and professionals to plant drought resistant trees and crops;
- 6. Accepts the restoration of ecosystems in the context of wildlife;

#### Restoration

- Restores vegetation and biodiversity, promote ecological restoration and stability of land;
- 8. Strongly condemns overgrazing that leads to soil degradation;

### Education and guidelines for action

- 9. Further recommends people to be educated on water sustainability;
- Accepts that the education on desertification greatly affects a positive outcome on the future generation;
- Considers that there is a need for national government agencies and international organizations to strengthen exchanges and communication;
- 12. Expresses the hope that governments will pay attention to the concerns raised by the UNCD.
