Topic: The situation in the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine

Acknowledging the people suffering and in need of help in the currently occupied territories of Ukraine,

Conscious of the global impact of the events of the Russo-Ukrainian war,

Fully alarmed by the damage caused by violent warfare in the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine, such as the loss of freedom of speech, massive casualties on both sides, and mass destruction, with many people needing help and support

Acknowledging the efforts of the United Nations in mediating the conflict recognising the need for international cooperation;

Taking into account the existing sanctions upon the Russian Federation,

Noting further that the Russian Federation claims that they are doing what is right for their country and can use their veto power to prevent resolutions form passing,

The Global Impact of War

- 1. Taking into consideration a ceasefire negotiation in a third party country;
- 2. Further invites privileged countries to take part in a coalition under the UN;
- 3. Encourages giving funds to developing countries;

4. Emphasizes trade partnership between war affected countries;

Safety and Aid for peoples in Ukraine

- 5. Condemns the Russian Federation for their unfair invasion of a peaceful country;
- 6. Calls upon the international community to aid displaced refugees;
- 7. Urges the Russian Federation to consider their impact on Ukranian people;
- 8. Draws the attention of the world to the situation in the occupied territories;
- 9. Reminds member states of their aim towards world peace;

Peace Making

- 10. Emphasizes the importance of United Nations peacekeeping missions;
- 11. Urges the implementation of a ceasefire to ensure further negotiations;
- 12. Calls upon member states of the UN to consider peaceful and necessary sanctions worldwide:
- 13. Expresses its hope that peaceful protection will be established across all borders;
- 14. Requests the committee to oversee elections worldwide to ensure they remain fair and peaceful;
- 15. Further invites neutral parties to host and oversee peace negotiations between Ukraine and Russia:
- 16. Supports the removal of sanctions on Russia provided Russia pulls their troops out of Ukraine;

Global Intervention

- 17. Further invites citizens to show more public support to stop the war through peaceful protests or press conferences;
- 18. Encourages member states to make all pertinent information widespread;
- 19. Affirms the danger of the use of nuclear weapons in the war in Ukraine.
