Topic: Promoting international cooperation on peaceful uses in the context of international security

Alarmed by the amount of nuclear weapons worldwide,

Aware of the mismanagement of arms in countries,

Convinced that international communities would highly benefit all nations in the context of human security,

Alarmed by the amount of nations struggling with national security,

Bearing in mind that scientific and technological advances will impact security,

Deeply concerned by the lack of security and the action to support it,

Fully aware of the possible misuse of technology,

The Management of Arms and Countries

1. Advises the elimination of non permitted weapon sales;
2. Proposes developing an arms committee to establish stricter gun rules including higher age limits;
3. Recommends countries to ban all arms unless allowed by the arms committee;

4. Urges the disposal of nuclear weapons and to have a treaty that inhibits countries from making nuclear weapons but instead use the excess energy as a sustainable power source;
5. Calls for countries to maintain non-proliferation;

International Committees and Summits

6. Suggests educating citizens of all levels about the proliferation of weapons of any kind;
7. Recommends creating an international committee that will hold annual summits, so Summit member states can present UN funded solutions that help solve the world wide problems in the context of international security;
8. Supports member states in finding ways to reduce security threats;
9. Encourages more developed member states to assist less developed states with national security;
10. Advises to take concrete measures to promote international cooperation;
11. Approves creating alliances during annual summits;

Invest in the Future

12. Further requests that member states welcome organizations to exchange information about technologies and materials to increase overall international mutual trust;
13. Endorses mitigating production of Weapons of Mass Destruction;

Using Technology to Improve Security

14. Takes note of the opportunity to create robots for peacekeeping and assistance;
15. Recognizes the importance of global technological cooperation when dealing with security;
16. Noting the importance of technology in relation to sustainable development;
17. Strongly encourages the creation of a hotline where a free call can be made to report suspicious activity.
