Topic: Reducing space threats through norms, rules and principles of responsible behaviors

Fully aware that space debris are a major threat to both space exploration and life on earth,

Alarmed by the use of weapons in space that may cause unnecessary armed conflicts between countries.

Expressing concerns that space debris and conflicts using technologies disrupts the transparency of organizations in space,

Noting with satisfaction that there has been countries that have contributed to organization in space, although there could be more work done in transparency,

## **Space Debris**

- 1. Strongly encourages licensing of spacecraft while making them reusable;
- 2. Advises countries to slow down satellite and spacecraft production under the

supervision of the UN;

- 3. Recognizes that we should develop sustainable satellites to safely land on earth after use;
- 4. Calls upon all member states to be responsible and contribute a portion of technology and information that may be beneficial while not violating privacy rights to create a friendly environment that demonstrates mutual trust and respect in space;

### **Space Weapons**

5. Asks that all weapons should be used for peaceful purposes in space and before used should be approved by the UN to remove space debris;

### **Space Organization**

- Encourages protocols to be established to strengthen treaties regarding space and transparency;
- 7. Emphasizes the importance of private space companies being aware of the fact that organization and transparency is needed to a point;
- Requests countries to commit to creating organizations regarding satellite approval and safety;

# Transparency of Space Devices, Intentions, and Components

- Notes that organization is key to promoting transparency of private space companies and their activities;
- 10. Recommends for member states to negotiate with private space companies in terms of transparency and organization to reduce threats.
