Topic: Promoting international cooperation on peaceful uses in the context of international security

Expecting countries to promote the importance of internet safety, and security,

Aware of the importance of raising awareness in cooperation to maintain peace and balance amongst member states,

Noting with deep concern how scamming and phishing has caused millions of dollars to be lost,

Fully aware of hackers, scammers, and cybercriminals,

Noting with deep concern that personal information and money is being stolen worldwide,

Fully alarmed of the presence of nuclear weapons,

Keeping in mind how many member states are using conventional weapons illegally,

The Use of Conventional and Nuclear Weapons

1. Urges member states to create stricter laws regulating conventional weapons including guns and landmines;
2. Reminds countries to limit their production of conventional and Nuclear Weapons;
3. Understands the consequences of manufacturing and using weapons of mass destruction;
4. Recommends member states to put a full ban and confiscation on the use of nuclear weapons;

Security

5. Calls for member states to educate youth about online;
6. Further requests the creation of an organization that finds and debates about solutions to cybercriminals;
7. Further requests that security programs be made to train people to responsibly use AI and stop cyber crimes;
8. Emphasizes the need to bring security agents, and services to less developed areas hoping to put a stop to identity theft;

Promoting and Raising Awareness in International Cooperation and Peace

9. Encourages countries to promote economic and social friendships;
10. Calls upon member states to encourage better understanding of global conflicts amongst communities;
11. Recommends for countries to collaborate in plans to make the world a better place;

12. Further invites for member states to promote the importance of peace on social media;
13. Trusts all member states to take part of global situations that needs to be brought to attention;
14. Expresses its hope for countries to promote the importance of the safe use of technology such as AI;
15. Further requests for countries to use and promote technology for innovative ways to connect with different cultures;

Criminal Activity Online

16. Calls for AI software and websites to be government approved and monitored;
17. Encourages schools to educate children on digital safety;
18. Advises citizens to use strong passwords and VPNs;
19. Supports the idea of an anti-virus sponsored by the government available to the public for free;
20. Calls for investment in virtual private network technologies.
