Topic: Empowering Youth in Inclusive and Sustainable Food Systems

Taking into account the amount of people who don't have jobs or are in poverty due to the lack of access to a well paying job, hence this affects children's health,

Recognizing people need jobs with payment so that people can send their children to school,

Having considered people also cannot make a lot of money themselves by selling their crops, because one would need money to grow crops,

Expanding and Continuing Existing Solutions

1. Further recommends the reduction of illegal drugs;
2. Encourages shipping food from rich agricultural countries to poor, such as food coming from greenhouses;

Donations

3. Also recommends donating any money, food, or clothes that are not needed;
4. Considers creating stores where the prices of medicine are lower for people in extreme conditions;
5. Calls upon governments to donate money for farmlands;
6. Strongly encourages grocery stores to have donations stands and limit the production of processed and unhealthy food;
7. Emphasizes donations with the belief that expanding fundraisers would encourage other kids and adults to help take part in activism;

Better Paying Jobs

8. Calls upon people who are unemployed can get jobs with better hygiene and clothes with lower prices;
9. Seeking solutions to these problems could be increasing the amount of jobs in homeless areas;
10. Supports the idea of creating better paying jobs, jobs would be helpful for parents to have more money to buy more healthy and nutritious food for their children;

Educating and Empowering Youth

11. Taking into consideration to add more security for farmlands in case of emergencies;
12. Further recommends more community to be built where the product has a big discount;
13. Recommends more countries to invest in more community pantries and fridges;
14. Strongly encourages education and food for the malnourished, hoping that children would realize the importance of these problems and increase the amount of people who want to help.
