3. Further requests various governments to spread information on farming so they can provide food for people in need;
4. Recommends the creation of an international agricultural education program;

5. Suggests lowering prices in financially unstable areas;
6. Further requests that various governments should open more food banks;
7. Further invites solutions for the cause;

8. Strongly advises the use of hydroponic farming;
