## Topic: Human rights and the environment

## Human Resources and eco-friendly alternatives

- I. Encourages renewable and eco-friendly energy through affordable and acceptable electric vehicles and solar power;
- 2. Recommends the use of eco-friendly and reusable materials through lowering the price of alternative construction materials;
- 3. Requests member states Implement strict measures for factories to ensure their pollution levels are more strictly controlled and within safety protocol;
- 4. Encourages member states to adopt eco-friendly tours;
- 5. Requests member states make contracts to get renewable energy at a fixed price;
- 6. Calls upon the member states to ensure the human rights to a clean and sustainable environment in the laws;

#### **Education for All**

- 1. Endorses the concept of government-funded projects and classes, dedicated to educating people about the environment and the waters around it;
- Recommends annual national assessments for teachers and students knowledge on sustainability;
- 3. Instructs schools on what to do during a natural disaster;
- 4. Congratulates all schools that include sustainability, SDGs, and more in their curriculum;
- 5. Further recommends education institutions to not neglect teaching student about the environment;

#### **Pollution and Climate**

- 7. Endorses the use of more renewable energies to stop contributing to air pollution
- I. Encourages people to limit the use of non-renewable products, and emphasizes the idea of renewable energy;
- 2. Calls for the studies of new tech that contribute to the environment;
- 3. Request that member states create companies to encourage less plastic use;
- 4. Calls upon member states to create more laws that prevent water pollution;

### **Global Changes**

- 6. Emphasizes the fact that clean water resources are essential;
- 7. Expresses regret towards the uprising number of flash floods due to climate change;
- 8. Further Recommends countries to use more eco-friendly resources;

- 9. Strongly encourages protected wildlife areas in forests;
- 10. Draws the attention to water crisis as it is a problem to many people.
