Topic: Human rights and the environment

Recognising deforestation has a significant impact on the well-being that the population can achieve,

Acknowledges the pollution of water,

Deeply concerned of the rights to water, referring to the principles and relations that govern access, distribution, and sustainable management of water as a vital resource for humanity and the environment,

Acknowledges that the economy relies on natural resources and natural resources are diminishing,

Alarmed by how 2022 compared to the previous year, highlighting a new historical record of 57.4 gigaton of CO2 equivalent,

Deeply concerned about the amount of carbon emission into the air, and that air pollution kills 7 million people every year,

Deeply regretting discrimination towards women,

Acknowledging that human rights are connected to the environment, anything that changes the environment will change human rights,

Alarmed by almost 1 in 3 women have experienced physical violence,

Taking note that around the world, approximately 1 billion children have experienced physical or emotional violence in the past year;

Deeply concerned that people have been killed for believing in certain religions recently;

Keeping in mind education is a basic human right that works to raise men and women out of poverty, level inequalities and ensure sustainable development, but worldwide 244 million children and youth are still out of school for social, economic and cultural reasons.

Acknowledging how the use of plastic causes harm,

Recognizing the need for greater use of renewable energies,

Bearing in mind the need for green energy and eco-friendly plastics,

Further recalling the recovery of ecosystems to reverse the changes produced in the environment,

Against Pollution

1. Encourages implementing sustainable agricultural technologies and practice to reduce water demand in agriculture;
2. Acknowledges the need of more sewers to be built to prevent rising sea levels;
3. Implement reforestation and restoration projects in degraded areas to combat desertification and restore biodiversity;
4. Draws the attention to the prevention of pollution;
5. Recommends not to transport water through lead pipes;
6. Suggests promoting reforestation;
7. Advises keeping sewage systems away from clean water sources;
8. Implements policies to restrict the amount of water you can use at one time especially on farms;
9. Strongly encourages having a good sustainable water management model;
10. Requests giving access to more water filters in remote places where they do not have access to clean water;

Renewable Energy

11. Further developing investment in renewable energy;
12. Encourages the government to lower taxes for people to buy electric cars;
13. Supports trying to convince other countries to reduce global emissions by 5%;

14. Authorize putting solar panels on parking lots with roofs to generate clean energy and use that energy to charge electric cars and other things;
15. Requests using less gas for cars;
16. Set more ambitious goals for the implementation of clean energy participation in the diversity of unconventional renewable energies;
17. Recommends we must strengthen and implement environmental police and regulations to control greenhouse gas emissions and pollution;
18. Suggests countries to implement renewable energy sources, alternatives that do not depend on geopolitical factors like fossil fuels do;

19. Requests setting up adult teaching centers to not discriminate different religions;
20. Advises people to stay proud of themselves for who they are;
21. Encourages different religions to thrive with each other and work together ;
22. Strongly encourages taking homosexuality off the mental illness list;
23. Takes note of discrimination between genders;
24. Strongly encourages city social gatherings to play music of indigenous people so that people can respect everyone and make new friendships;
25. Recommends the government to put more laws against water pollution so that the human right to clean water doesn't deteriorate;
26. Recommends not getting into physical or emotional violence with others;
27. Expresses its hope that people accepts different religions;

Ecosystem and Investing

28. Supports implementing sustainable agricultural technologies and practices to reduce water demands in agriculture;
29. Calls for cleaning up the ecosystem by using clean energies;
30. Considers using less fossil fuels in order to reduce CO2 emissions;
31. Urges to promote organic soil management to improve soil conditions;
32. Encourages the use of biodegradable plastic alternatives to replace non-biodegradable plastics;
33. Adopts scientific research to reduce global gas emissions;

34. Suggests working collaboratively on the international level to address the issue of plastic pollution in the environment by sharing the best practices, technologies and research;
35. Encourages the development and management of sustainable agricultural ecosystems and making it easier for farmers to control pests and weeds without the use of any chemicals;
36. Calls upon to promote an international cooperation forum to share experiences about sustainable urbanization ensuring the health of citizens and natural urban ecosystems;
37. Recommends the use of bio materials such as mushroom mycelium which will be a replacement of some plastic and more in the future;
38. Advises scientific research for the creation of eco-friendly plastic and green energy;
39. Suggests offering subsidies to sustainable companies.
