## **Topic: Empowering Youth in Inclusive and Sustainable Food Systems**

Alarmed by the lack of agricultural education and employment in urban areas,

Taking into consideration that agricultural education for the youth is crucial,

Emphasizing the importance of the social safety nets for youth by creating sustainable food systems,

Reaffirming the importance of youth involvement in agriculture and employment in the future,

Encouraging youth self-expression and passion in agriculture,

Drawing attention to a nutritional cycle where food waste is absent,

Deeply disturbed by the lack of interest in agriculture as a potential career,

Emphasizing the issues of current transportation methods, such as non-sustainable fuel and the lack of efficiency of the vehicles,

Emphasizing the need for youth education,

Expecting agricultural funding in schools,

Concerned by the high demand for agricultural resources caused by a lack of investments,

#### Youth Recruitment

- 1. Advises educational institutions to develop a class in their curriculum where students can learn agricultural practices;
- 2. Calls upon a collaboration of countries to fund schools against agricultural plastic waste;
- 3. Encourages youth to participate in sustainable farming to reduce agricultural waste;

## **Agricultural Employment**

- 4. Endorses NGOs for youth education;
- 5. Further requests for the governments to fund school programs;
- 6. Suggests hosting fundraisers for agricultural assistance;
- 7. Calls upon the youth to take a step into developing modern technologies that refine the agricultural process;
- 8. Strongly encourages the governments to help local food pantries and volunteers that help lower-income areas with their agricultural stance;

## **Agricultural Education**

- 9. Invites those who are interested in agriculture to pursue their activities using extracurriculars;
- 10. Adopts the idea of investing in small-scale farms and regional food chains to include youth on farms;
- II. Recommends the teaching of agriculture by introducing farming practices in local programs and schools;
- 12. Recommends that young farmers become a part of sustainable food systems while stressing the need to abide by labor rights and policies;

# Funding Agricultural Systems

- 13. Strongly encourages the use of sustainable eco-friendly fuel sources for transportation and renewable energy;
- 14. Calls for education, social media, and other platforms to pique interest in agricultural careers;
- 15. Encourages governments to set up policies for farmers and provide them with resources to boost their incomes;
- 16. Reaffirms the use of sustainable farming to increase food production and reduce pollution;
- 17. Encourages the organizations to support agriculture through employment.
