Bearing in mind that inequality is still an issue in many ways,

Technology and Security

1. Encourages technology to be used for agricultural purposes;
2. Confirms the importance of youth and agriculture;
3. Draws the attention to the issue of insecurity in agricultural technology;
4. Further request security in natural food systems;
5. Calls upon farmers to make food systems more secure by using sustainable farming tools;
6. Advises nations to work together in order to take action in food security;
7. Emphasizes the problem of insecure technology in agricultural through education;
8. Urges governments to prioritize food storage and food transportation;

Financial Help

9. Invites people to donate to food banks and charity;
10. Further requests countries worldwide to build underground food stocks in case of wars or disasters using the county's agricultural support;
11. Recommends citizens to support the local products of the country because it is more affordable and more sustainable than imports;
12. Welcomes all nations to clean plastics to grow our crop properly;

13. Draws the attention to the fact that educational institution need to offer informative programs to children about sustainable agriculture systems;
14. Strongly encourages charities, governments, NGOs and communities to donate to food banks for people in need;
15. Urges large companies to promote food sustainability by printing notes on commonly purchased products;
16. Strongly recommends the creation of stores or institutions that are funded by collected taxes where monthly allowances can be traded for free food;
