Topic: Countering the use of information and communications technologies for criminal purposes

Alarmed by the increasing threats due to the lack of cybersecurity,

Noting with deep regret the added amount of opportunities given to cyber criminals due to the advancement of technology,

Aware of the increasing privacy breaches,

Fully alarmed by apps that could be stealing people's information,

Aware of the risks and dangers of cybercrime because countries are struggling to take action,

Deeply concerned about the number of people being hacked on the internet,

Noting with satisfaction the efforts made internationally to combat cybercrime,

Acknowledging the fact that there is not enough cybercrime recovery and insurance,

International defense and funding

1. Calls upon countries to share information regarding cybersecurity;
2. Encourages countries to set up educational programs to promote the safe use of internet;
3. Urges gadget manufacturers to install free antivirus applications;
4. Requests that IT experts from around the world meet up to create a skilled cybersecurity workforce;
5. Recommends governments to allocate a budget for equipment used to defend against cybercrime;
6. Urges gadget manufacturers to implement an algorithm that detects suspicious activity and alerts the user, and how to prevent it;
7. Further requests hiring tech firms and ethical hackers to assist law enforcement to prevent cybercrime;

Privacy, apps, and websites

8. Advises the government to make apps that notify citizens if their private info has been leaked and advises citizens to check their app regularly;
9. Urges Member States to promote better cybersecurity to help big companies;
10. Urges that the government should invest in AI for protecting data and apps;
11. Requests that apps give higher clarity in online cookies policies and offers rejection to it;
12. Urges the government to give job offers to former cyber criminals that will protect internet from active cyber criminals;

Education about cybercrime

13. Further invites more schools to teach their students how to prevent cybercrime;
14. Encourages the community to take action on cyber threats by spreading awareness to citizens;
15. Draws the attention towards educating all citizens on how to tackle cybercrime;
16. Encourages countries to work together to succeed the SDG goal 4 Quality Education;
17. Recommends adding security systems to apps;
18. Calls for educational campaign for all ages;

Cyber crime recovery & prevention

19. Further invites governments to trust and invest new safer technology and to invest to AI to prevent cybercrime;
20. Requests the members states to publish more articles on combating cybercrime;
21. Strongly encourages the member states to make a treaty to assure that all the countries have guidelines and rules for advanced technology depending on their GDP;
22. Appeals to the use of more anti-virus systems;
23. Trusts that creating jobs for former cyber criminals will be extremely beneficial;
24. Recommends the use of programmes that shows which sites are dangerous;
25. Urges for those that are not well educated to ask trusted people before doing anything online.
