



## **Resolution United Nations Security Council/I.1**

### **United Nations Security Council Committee**

**Topic:** The situation in the temporarily occupied territories of Ukraine

Alarmed by the human rights violations among all affected groups,

Deeply concerned about the state of conflict zones in Ukraine,

Acknowledging that both, short and long-term solutions are necessary to ensure peace,

Expressing concern for the importance of international cooperation and solidarity in supporting peace efforts providing humanitarian assistance and addressing the root of causes of conflicts,

Acknowledges the importance of an international collaboration,

Deeply concerned for those affected in this conflict,

### **Human rights enforcement**

1. Calls upon member states to monitor human rights violations ensuring accountability for perpetrators;
2. Recommends measures to safeguard civilians particularly vulnerable groups;

### **Long & Short-term solutions**

3. Calls upon neighboring countries to help Ukraine with humanitarian support in the region;
4. Also calls for peacekeeping missions in order to avoid more casualties;
5. Introduces support for displaced Ukrainians Civilians to return to their homes;
6. Draws attention to the lack of prisoners' rights;
7. Demands immediate access for healthcare and NGOs to conflict zones;

## **Humanitarian Aid**

8. Prioritizes support for displaced Ukrainians and those affected in conflicts;
9. Calls upon other delegations to help Ukraine by providing humanitarian assistance and support in the region;

## **International support and investment in Ukraine**

10. Further invites NGOs to provide general support in the affected area;
11. Urges peaceful negotiations between Ukraine and Russia in order to attain peace as soon as possible;
12. Urges access to education for children affected by the conflict and re-building damaged schools and educational infrastructure.
