Topic: Reduction of military budgets

Alarmed by the continuous rise of military budgets for the ninth year in a row,

Deeply disturbed by the destruction of mass weapons,

Aware of the fact that there are many dangerous materials used in weapons,

Deeply concerned that not all nations have a peaceful agreement amongst each other,

Alarmed by the fact that the youth does not know about military budgets,

Deeply concerned that schools have not implemented courses on military budgets,

Fully alarmed by the fact that youth and students' education budgets are rising,

Bearing in mind how far behind a large group of countries are on reaching the Sustainable Development Goals by 2030,

Fully aware of the need of funds for humanitarian and sustainable development,

Deeply concerned that too many weapons are being made, changing the cost of weaponry may be problematic,

Reduction of mass weaponry

1. Adopts regional peace treaties to promote peace and harmony;
2. Advises to use more sustainable weapon material;

3. Emphasizes the option of melting weapons and ammunition to make more sustainable materials;
4. Endorses other countries to create an organization to create military resources;
5. Further requests the G4 and NATO to assist other nations that are capable or want to in reduce their nuclear arsenal, helping to reduce military budgets;

Education

6. Encourages countries to use more sustainable materials like steel for their defensive weapons;
7. Endorses an online program about military budgets;
8. Encourages schools to incorporate a lesson on military budgets;
9. Recommends military budgets to fundamental things such as health infrastructure and education;

Life in 2030

10. Approves of the limitation of weaponry production;

Reduction of military resources

11. Suggests countries to use 3% of their military budget to support the progression of working on the SDGs;
12. Requests the reduction of costs for weaponry but only for countries reducing their military budget;
13. Calls upon countries to decrease the amount of weapon factories accordingly.
