Farming Technology

1. Calls upon an alliance in developing farming technology;
2. Draws attention to invest in enhanced food storage;
3. Strongly recommends countries to lower food prices proportional to income;
4. Suggests that countries should invest in hydroponics, aeroponics, or artificial rain;
5. Encourages countries to support each other in agriculture;

6. Recommends that governments should invest in saltwater tanks for farmers around the world;
7. Acknowledges that permaculture is a possible natural solution;

Money

8. Invite schools to provide free food to students if possible;
9. Encourages rich countries to give poor countries seeds, technology, water, and financial support;
10. Recommends composting food waste into fertilizer;
11. Calls for more frequent UN meetings online about the food issues and how to solve it;
12. Request more education for farmers and better farming techniques and tools;

Food Supplies

13. Calls upon member states to pass a law that will enforce monthly health inspections to ensure clean and proper food;
14. Encourages countries to test which crops grow best in their climate;
15. Further recommends to keep emergency supplies of food;
16. Supports war donations so that countries can access food and medicine supplies;

Climate

17. Recomonds member states to bring the people food after disasters;
18. Calls upon fellow member states to adopt better irrigation systems;
19. Draws attention to the importance of researching better farming techniques.
