#### **Topic: Engaging boys and girls in gender equality**

Observing that 70% of women were killed in war zones,

Considering that men who have access to education were worse in the past,

#### **Equality of jobs and education for all genders**

1. Providing equal opportunities for both men and women;
2. Strongly recommends destroying the pay gap between genders;
3. Welcoming women's voices by global corporations and organizations;

### **Changing the world's view on gender**

4. Supports using social media to fight gender inequality and teach solutions;
5. Encouraging men and women to campaign for women's rights;
6. Refuse to continue violence against women globally;
7. Emphasizing a changed curriculum without gender stereotypes and harm towards women;

### **Spreading Awareness Through Education**

8. Draws attentions to the lack of education regarding gender equality in rural areas;
9. Encourages schools globally to implement extra curricular activities for people to learn about self-defense and women's rights;
10. Reserving seats for women in parliament and advises governments to implement gender sensitive teachings for schools worldwide;
11. Encouraging schools globally to educate students on the history of gender equality and the causes of war;
12. Further invites countries to provide funding to education in local schools and war zones;

### **Protecting Women's Rights**

14. Endorses men to learn and discuss how to prevent violence against women.
