Topic: Reduction of military budgets

Noting with a deep concern that climate change is a large issue,

Acknowledging the growth of military expenditures,

Recognizing the lack of action for military spending reduction,

Acknowledges that conflicts are a barrier to reducing military budgets,

Emphasizing the importance of reducing weapons considering countries still possess them,

Taking into consideration that agreement and cooperation of multiple nations worldwide is,

needed to achieve global cooperation and peace by reducing military budgets,

Fully aware of the lack of education on reduction of military budgets,

Reducing Military expenditures and budgets

1. Recommends countries to spend a max of 4% Purchasing Power Parity;
2. Suggests financial strategies in reducing military budget and optimizing cost efficiency;
3. Strongly encourages military spending report treaty;

Environmental and Social Stability

1. Invites to relocating military budgets into environmental issues;
2. Suggests to divert military funds to healthcare programs and mental health programs;
3. Supports adding social media campaigns to increase awareness in military expenditures, and its effect on our environment;
4. Encourage member states to have a climate change reduction program;

Humanitarian efforts

1. Addressing global inequality and preventing unnecessary conflict;
2. Requests member states to relocate funds into humanitarian programs;
3. Encourages countries to decrease manufacturing and importing weapons and conducting nuclear tests;
4. Expresses its hope to create communities to aid and feed the rural and in-conflict areas;
5. Calls upon schools to educate their students on the global impact of military budgets for long term stability;

Working with other nations to help stabilize conflict zones

1. Endorses the re-allocation of excess military budgets into aiding civilians in conflict zones;
2. Urges countries to support peacekeeping missions to reduce conflicts.
