#### **Topic: Green cities**

Emphasizing that developing countries lack the funds to construct sustainable cities and infrastructures,

Acknowledging the need to invest in green cities and infrastructure,

Aware that educating the public about sustainability will help the planet,

Deeply concerned by the lack of peri-urban infrastructure in large municipalities,

Expecting the need to use green and sustainable energy practices in daily life,

Observing mismanagement of resources in cities,

#### **Public Awareness for Sustainability**

1. Calls upon member states to promote green infrastructure;
2. Endorses the exchange of knowledge, blueprints and strategies to reduce pollution between member states;
3. Encourages countries to engage the youth in green cities;
4. Invites the public to learn about sustainability;

5. Further recommends member states have annual meetings to continue finding solutions and creating programs internationally;
6. Supports countries organizing groups to help sustainability;

### **Funding for Sustainable Redevelopment**

7. Strongly encourages member states to re-invest in the construction of sustainable and eco-friendly infrastructure;
8. Draws the attention to the need for public endorsement dedicated to creating green cities and spaces;
9. Urges government to enforce, create and protect sustainable housing constructed with eco-friendly materials;
10. Calls for governments to refurbish standing cities to be more green;
11. Introduces the idea for governments to fund integrated biodiversity and plant life;

### **Green and Sustainable Practices**

12. Calls upon member states to use clean and greener energy;
13. Supports the development of buildings not to be in areas that are vulnerable to climate change;
14. Emphasizes the need for peri-urban and urban agriculture to diminish food insecurity in cities;
15. Urges the need for regulations and warning systems for water and air pollution;
16. Recommends that everyone should be responsible in the management of their waste;
17. Considers the planting of trees in urban areas to reduce air pollution;
18. Further recommends the use of greener and raw materials in construction;

### **Sustainable Infrastructure and Transportation**

19. Encourages the redevelopment of green spaces within urban areas such as vertical gardens, remodeling public parks, and adding more greenery throughout cities;
20. Further invites cities to redevelop abandoned buildings into sustainable homes that run on green energy;
21. Calls for the remodeling of the public transit to be more clean and efficient with a large range while running on sustainable energy if possible;
22. Invites member states to help fund cities that are affected by natural disasters to then make them sustainable and green.
