Alarmed by the violence and discrimination women face,

Emphasizing the dire need to bring awareness to the issue,

Acknowledging the need to be treated the same despite gender,

Concerned by the historical gender stereotypes,

Aware of the violence against women,

Deeply concerned about the lack of attention to gender equality,

Desiring to work collaborating and reach a consensus by international cooperation,

Alarmed by the amount of people not getting education about gender equality,

Taking into consideration that not every citizen has foundation for education,

Deeply conscious to the lack of women in leadership roles,

Desiring women to get equal education, in order to acquire gender equality,

Gender equality awareness in media

1. Urges the government to promote gender equality in media;
2. Encourages powerful media influencers to promote events supporting gender equality;
3. Further recommends female role models to share their stories of how they experienced gender inequality through online media;
4. Strongly encourages well-known companies to advocate for gender equality;
5. Expresses the importance of having a male role model to advocate for women's rights;
6. Further invites the government to fund organizations that focus on gender equality;
7. Introduces the idea of online filters to remove gender inequality online;

Programs for gender equality

8. Noting with regret the way women in the past were treated;
9. Additionally, Equimundo is a global strategic plan for violence prevention for women;
10. Urging nations to start using the Trocaire program that allows men to talk about the topic of gender inequality in groups;
11. Acknowledging non-profit organizations that aim to ensure gender equality and help women campaign important issues in politics, such as the NGO she should run organization;
12. Drawing the attention of millions to the MeToo# campaign to enlighten people on social media, both male and female, on the harassment of females in their place of work;

13. Calls upon countries to accept the idea of gender equality and implement gender equality programs and campaigns;
14. Initiating programs to stop gender inequality like the He-for-She where men and women partnered with the program;

Strides to reach gender equality

15. Calls upon member states to fund organizations and campaigns, promoting gender equality between men and boys;
16. Recommends more action combating this issue including women publicly speaking about experiences of gender inequality;
17. Emphasizes the need for gender equality in conflict affected areas;
18. Desiring equal celebration of both men and women accomplishments;

Education on gender equality

19. Encourages schools and guardians to promote and educate future generations about gender equality;
20. Welcomes programs to help men and women work collaboratively within gender equality based activities in order to have an open view;
21. Intended to adopt a comprehensive approach that combines effective public policies, education for gender equality, accessible justice and adequate protection;
22. Emphasizes the importance of incorporating gender equality topics into school curriculum and organizing interactive workshops.
