Concerned by the lack of accessible education on healthcare standards,

Referring to online platforms for spreading awareness,

Welcoming agencies to help provide healthcare for the citizens in the country,

Acknowledging the lack of healthcare facilities in rural areas,

Recognizes that not all member states and nations have the resources to provide healthcare all of its citizens financially,

Deeply concerned that financial issues of nation sand citizens leads to gap in healthcare issues

Acknowledging the absence of global cooperation among nations,

Alarmed by the lack of resources and aid provided to countries,

Awareness in Education

1. Calls upon all countries to educate their citizens on healthcare;
2. Suggest a training program to be created with multiple nations to share their knowledge of treatment;
3. Affirms that social media is widely used and would be beneficial in educating the masses;

4. Advises that media and other means of education on healthcare standards are implemented in schools and work environments;
5. Recommends the creation of an NGO that brings first aid training to workplaces and educational facilities;
6. Requests that member states make their citizens aware of current disease precautions;
7. Further requests that online education programs be put in place for hard-to-reach areas, potentially providing aid for internet access;

Access to Health Care

8. Calls upon member states to improve healthcare facilities through funding and new technologies;
9. Advises for pharmacies and/or clinics to be installed in more rural areas for improved access to healthcare;
10. Calls for developed member states to help provide infrastructure for methods such as telemedicine;
11. Supports the idea of healthcare equal and accessible for everyone no matter their gender, race, or other attributes;
12. Encourages able countries to financially assist in transportation costs when the current location's medical needs are not up to standard;

Finances

13. Strongly encourages developed nations to provide resources and/or funding or healthcare to developing nations;
14. Encouraging member states to develop technology that can be used to provide healthcare gradually and sharing this technology with other nations;
15. Recommends nations provide government programs allowing its citizens to access healthcare without taking on the financial burden if applicable;
16. Advises collaboration between member states and NGOs to provide healthcare;
17. Institutes member states to collaborate on innovative technology and efficiency of healthcare systems;
18. Requests member nations will fund technology to decrease the cost of care;

Global Collaboration

19. Encouraging a collaborative relation between countries without a universal healthcare system and for those countries that are not completely developed in terms of healthcare;
20. Urges the creation of annual summits for broader engagement and ongoing collaboration on the critical issue of UHC;
21. Further invites member states to increase funding towards fellow nations to improve systems related to the UHC, with potential for incentives specific to that nation;
22. Emphasises the need for a system involving contributions by member states and organizations to provide aid and resources.
