General Assembly First Committee

Topic: Reduction of military budgets

Taking into account that policies towards military spending are greatly lacking,

Fully alarmed that there is no government body that oversees military expenditures,

Acknowledges that policies are not strict enough,

Believing children should get educated about the policy of military expenditures,

Bearing in mind that there are over 875 million weapons in the world,

Deeply concerned about the nuclear weapons increasing at an alarming rate,

Reaffirming the importance of controlling weapons,

Fully aware of the reduction of military weapons,

Observing that numerous member states are not transparent about their military,

Noting with deep concern that some nations are not collaborating and combining their

strengths to create more prosperous countries,

Underlining the vitality of youth rights,

Emphasizing the importance of equal protection for times of crisis,

Recognizing the importance of the SDG's and transferring some money from military spending,

Acknowledging diplomacy is important, violence distracts people from educating others,

Firmly convinced keeping military budgets under freeze conditions will create timely peace and a less weaponized world,

Keeping in mind recycling weapons into resources will create less waste that will help reduce climate change,

Set Policy

1. Request stricter laws for military spending;
2. Further invites member states to step away from production of nuclear weapons through new policies;
3. Call upon all nations to sign treaty about military spend and nuclear weapons;
4. Draws attention to policies on military spending;
5. Emphasizes regulation on weapon manufacturers in member states;
6. Encourages that new military policies needs to be put in place by funding through NGOs;
7. Expresses its hope for new military policies by getting money through the UN;

Reduction of Military Budgets and Weapons

8. Recommends that countries need to reduce guns used by citizens to ensure their safety;
9. Strongly urges countries that have not signed existing treaties on arms reduction to do so ensuring that they have reliable allies;
10. Expresses its hope that countries will implement education programs to educate people on the dangers of weapons;
11. Invites countries to be transparent about their nuclear arsenals;
12. Educate worldwide people to stop using weapons;
13. Encourages the governments to tax weapon companies less if they create emergency supplies;
14. Dedicating at least a certain amount of money based on the military budget towards the SDGs;

Allocating Resources to non-violent uses

15. Adopt education programs;
16. Encourages member states to divert the money they spend on their military towards the fundamental needs of people in need;
17. Approves meeting in person to create stronger bonds and reduce future conflicts;
18. Recommends diplomacy over violence for funding college and schools ;
19. Acknowledges effects of serious conflicts and help those unfortunate to be caught up in conflict zones;
20. Designates parts of the military budget towards SDGS;
21. Directs military budgets towards food and clothing to those in need

Global Exchanges and Cooperation

22. Strongly encourage that all nations should work together to help reduce military budgets;
23. Draws attention to redirecting at least three percent of a countries military budget toward humanitarian efforts;
24. Strongly urges all member states to report military spendings to increase transparency, paving a path to global treaties that enforce the reduction of military budgets;
25. Calls upon member states that have military spending of more than 3% of their GDP to help other nations in need;
26. Endorses nations to educate people on the importance of the SDGs in order to enhance global exchanges and cooperation;
27. Request nations to reduce the production of long ranged weapons which have a range of 2,000 miles total and non-nuclear by 50% and impose tariff of 25% on the trading of these weapons
