#### Topic: Relationship between disarmament and sustainable development

Acknowledging that not enough peace and disarmament treaties are signed and ratified,

Aware of existing treaties such as TPNW and all the countries that have already signed and ratified it,

Taking note that treaties are not acting fast enough towards disarmament and the SDGs,

Realizing the need to create treaties to disarm weapons,

Alarmed by the rapidly increasing production of weapons,

Recognizing the importance of reducing and recycling five to ten percent of of member states' firearms

Confident that reallocating resources to public sectors will truly improve nations worldwide

Fully believing that boosting secure measures through disarming terrorists

Alarmed by the fact that SDG's are being ignored,

Emphasizing that all nations need to commit to the no first use policy,

Fully alarmed that the public does not know much about the SDG's,

Expressing concerns on the timeline of SDG's,

Keeping in mind of the amount of money that goes into weapons,

Fully aware of economic crisis caused by war,

Acknowledging lowering military budgets,

Desiring governments of member states to tax weapon manufacturers,

## **Treaties and Conventions**

1. Emphasizes the need for yearly meetings regarding disarmament and the SDGs;
2. Further requests all member states to limit the procuring of the resources used to create weapons of mass destruction;
3. Calls for the adoption of a convention to reduce the trade in Military Arms by funding through NGOs;
4. Urges all nuclear, chemical and biological armed states to initiate reciprocal and verifiable reduction of these weapons;
5. Greatly encourages limiting the procurement of weapons to the global civilian population;
6. Expresses its hope for the establishment of a binding international agreement to prevent the militarization of outer space, furthermore the abolishment of all current weapons and military branches in outer space;

## **Reduction of Weapons**

7. Calls upon all member states to reduce their weapons and be transparent about their military expenditure;
8. Advises all member states to increase efforts to neutralize terrorists;
9. Encourages all member states to limit the production of nuclear and long-range weapons;
10. Requests nations to tax weapon manufacturers and transporters;
11. Urges all countries to research safer systems of weapon implementation and disarmament;
12. Calls for victims of war to write scripts and stories to educate the public on the importance of peace;
13. Supports the international community to set global weapon reduction goals that are tailored to a country's own economy, culture, and history;

## **Implementation of the SDGs**

14. Recommends money to be funded to the SDGs;
15. Advises reallocating three percent of the military budget to countries that can afford it;
16. Expresses its hope for further implementations of SDGs;

17. Encourages more acknowledgement of the SDGs;
18. Strongly recommends all member states to educate the public about the SDGs;
19. Suggests more cooperation between countries to help achieve the SDGs;
20. Trusts all member states to reduce their military spending over a three-year period towards the country's SDGs for countries who are not threatened;

#### **Subtopic four: Transfer of Money**

21. Encourages countries to lower military budgets and use them for SDGs;
22. Accepts the amount of money going to military training for defence;
23. Requests countries to truthfully disclose their military spending;
24. Calls for developing sustainable satellite disposal;
25. Draws the attention to countries military spending to have money to buy necessities;
26. Congratulates countries that agree to disarmament;
27. Calls attention to the economic crisis caused by war.
