Topic: Relationship between disarmament and sustainable development

Fully alarmed by the fact that people don't know about the SDGs,
Recognizing that weapons are harming the world,
Keeping in mind most schools don't have education about disarmament.
Disturbed by the amount of conflicts there are in our world today,
Observing the small amounts of money spent on sustainable development,
Alarmed by the fact that countries don't trust each other,
Fully aware that nuclear weapons are destructive to our environments,
Alarmed by the rate our environment is deteriorating,
Deeply concerned that technology is not being used safely and securely,
Fully aware some countries cannot help due to inner wars,
Deeply disturbed by the destruction of heavy weapons,
Aware of how much money it takes to deconstruct nuclear weapons,
Noting with deep regret how far behind in achieving disarmament and peace,

Education:

1. Urges the importance of disarmament;

2. Further requests all schools to teach SDGs accordingly;
3. Encourages countries to reduce weapon production accordingly ;
4. Invites countries to join the act of disarmament if able to;
5. Endorses advertisement about quality education for children and adults about disarmament;
6. Further recommends countries rearrange their military budget to SDGs accordingly and prioritize education if possible;
7. Advises schools to join us in this endeavor.

Trust between nations:

8. Encourages countries to end tensions with each other;
9. Supports countries joining the nuclear non-proliferation treaty;
10. Calls upon countries to make a peace treaty;
11. Requests countries to form new peace organizations if possible);

Protection of environment:

12. Encourages nations to reduce weapon production if possible;
13. Trusts that nations will take care of their environment;
14. Acknowledges general principles of cooperation in the maintenance of international peace and security;
15. Calls upon member states to use renewable energy.

Achieving the SDGs:

16. Call upon member states to make military civil guards if appropriate;
17. Encourages countries to give 10% of their military budget if safely possible to use it on the development of disarmament;
18. Urges countries to use renewable energy and sustainable materials for disarmament;
19. Invites countries to work together to achieve the SDG's by 2030 if safely possible.
