Topic: Women's meaningful participation in peace processes

Fully alarmed that young women and girls do not have enough access to a proper education and that they don't have a fundamental right to vote,

Bearing in mind that girls and women are unfortunately bullied for their gender and excluded from peace negotiations,

Acknowledging the fact that young women are not given equal right for seats in the parliament and education,

Emphasizing that women's education and parliamentary representation are important,

Noting that violence and lack of resources are disturbing problems of gender inequality,

Acknowledging, that women have been excluded for ages, even with the efforts of member states to find solutions,

Deeply concerned by the fact that women are harmed in violence which they are not participating in,

Expressing concern that women do not have enough roles in peace processes,

Equal rights for both men and women in leadership roles

1. Ensures women's active participation in peace processes, peace negotiations, and quality education;
2. Calls for governments to offer internships to young women and advise them to apply for leadership roles;
3. Endorses countries to reserve seating for women in peace committees;

Peace processes

4. Calls upon member states to collaborate and realize the importance of women's role in peace processes;
5. Further requests funding women's education through social media;
6. Recommends that countries with rich experiences could share their experiences with other countries about women's freedom;

Education

7. Urges all developed countries to give women equal voting rights and the right to access proper education;
8. Suggests well-developed countries and governments to fund 3% of income for women's education in rural areas;
9. Recommends schools worldwide to add extracurriculars that teach students regarding gender equality;
10. Encourages young children, especially girls, to practice leadership skills from a young age;

Gender Equality

11. Increase more sustainable resources to advocate women's voices and women programs;
12. Encourages that women enduring home violence speak up;
13. Requests for equal opportunities;
14. Strengthen legal protections of women from home violence.
