### Topic: Pandemic preparedness and response

Alarmed by the amount of unvaccinated people that died from the pandemic,

Acknowledging that vaccines, immunizations, and supplies need to be transported more efficiently.

Considering the countries that do not have enough resources and education which they need to be prepared for the next pandemic,

Bearing in mind that low-income countries do not have enough money to build healthcare facilities,

Emphasizing that some countries cannot afford, produce, or access medical supplies,

Having considered the need for more awareness about upcoming pandemic and quarantine protocols,

Deeply concerned that there are not enough resources to create advanced medical supplies,

### Vaccines, Immunizations, and Supplies

1. Encourages organizations to further develop vaccines and immunization using government funds;
2. Urges people to learn medical procedures so that countries are more prepared for pandemics;
3. Calls upon healthcare officials and government leaders to strengthen healthcare systems and increase supplies;

4. Encourages the government to provide more vaccinations for their citizens;
5. Call upon leaders to support their citizens' medical education to build trust in healthcare;
6. Approves that governments should create courses to fully educate their doctors in case another pandemic occurs;

#### **Planning, Response, and Education**

7. Calls upon all countries to run public awareness campaigns so that citizens are more prepared for another pandemic;
8. Requests for help from governments to find a way to share information about pandemics;
9. Recommends global organizations to donate money to other countries, helping them build hospitals and pharmacies;
10. Urges medical providers to ensure that they have enough equipment to be used when it is needed most, and if there is not enough, they either go to a global organization or neighboring country;
11. Calls for doctors, nurses, and other medical providers to be on standby in case a pandemic occurs;

#### **Affordability and Availability of Medical Supplies**

12. Invites governments to donate to an organization which transports the donations to developing countries in need so they can mass produce vaccines;
13. Recommends global organizations and non governmental organizations to use a percentage of their budget to send cargo planes with medical supplies to landlocked countries in need;
14. Requests that pharmaceutical businesses lower their prices on basic medical supplies in times of need;

#### **Quarantine Research and Awareness**

15. Recommends fully developed countries to donate supplies to advanced medical research;
16. Also urges educators to teach how to manufacture vaccines and advertise about how to stop the spread of disease;
17. Requests countries to practice lockdown procedures for their citizens' safety.
