Expressing concern that some medical schools are too expensive to get in to,

Realizing that most medical schools leave health professionals in debt,

Noting that people in rural areas cannot access healthcare education,

Noting that funding AI in medical care would be difficult,

Noticing the backlash from the media,

Aware that education of health professionals in most places is limited,

Acknowledging that most places cannot afford AI in healthcare,

Funding Hospitals

1. Calls upon more doctors and healthcare professionals to train more people;
2. Draws attention to letting people who want to be doctors to have better training;
3. Encourage to open more schools and colleges for doctors;
4. Affirms that all people even in rural areas should have access to healthcare;
5. Encourages to build local clinics and train doctors;

Doctor Employment

6. Supports international partners to help with funding;
7. Draws attention that government funding is necessary;
8. Supports the efforts of people helping with UHC;
9. Calls upon the citizens to fund the hospitals;
10. Further recommends that more people become doctors;
11. Encourages sending humanitarian aid to international allies;

Education

12. Calls upon medical schools to lower their expenses and increase scholarships;
13. Encourages better recognition and advertisement for hospitals;
14. Calls upon funding for aspiring doctors who cannot afford a good medical school;
15. Further encourages funding and education for doctors without borders;
16. Encourages integrating doctors from other nationalities;
17. Advises medical school to open camps in more rural areas;
18. Requests virtual schools for doctors;

19. Adopts AI software and technology to assist in teaching doctors;
20. Accepts the use of mobile healthcare;
21. Calls upon medical schools to lower their expenses;
