Topic: Pandemic preparedness and response

Recognizing that medical prices are not affordable for many people,

Noting that all humans should have the same rights on medical issues,

Mindful that people in rural areas cannot afford medical care,

Deeply convinced that the government should use its taxes to build more hospitals,

Taking note that not everyone has access to suitable vaccines,

Aware that many hospitals do not have access to vaccines,

Alarmed by the lack of vaccine preparedness for previous pandemics,

Noting with deep concern that not everyone who can afford vaccines can get access to them,

Deeply concerned that diseases are spreading and people are suffering,

Acknowledging that pandemic preparedness is a major issue,

Having devoted attention to the fact that people are not getting medical care,

Aware of the problem of viruses and pandemics,

Concerned by the fact that diseases are spreading fast,

Alarmed by the lack of medicine and vaccines and doctors,

Aware of the lack of medical professionals,

Encourage quarantine during viruses,

Fair Medical Prices

1. Encourages governments and international allies to lower the price of medicine by fundraising;
2. Further recommends to improve health infrastructure;
3. Requests medical care at fair prices;
4. Advises equal distribution of medical supplies around the country;

Vaccines and Medicines

5. Adopts a vaccine research center funded by WHO;
6. Encourages everybody with access to vaccines gets them;
7. Emphasizes better sanitation practices;
8. Calls upon international allies for help with funding vaccines;

Pandemic Preparedness

9. Calls upon more medical experts in hospitals;
10. Express its appreciation for doctors during pandemics;
11. Endorses the idea of telemedicine and advises the creation of fair insurance systems for all;
12. Also calls for all people to be ready and aware of pandemics by detecting new viruses and creating vaccines;

Prevention of Diseases

13. Urges people to get vaccinated as soon as possible;
14. Encourages government officials to open vaccine research centers if possible;
15. Calls upon the government to build more hospitals;
16. Introduces vaccines in pandemics.
