Topic: Corporate environmental responsibility

Recognizing that corporations lack motivation in supporting green initiatives resulting in poor management,

Noting with regret the negative effects on cooperate pollution on the environment,

Having considered the scarcity of resources,

Fully alarmed by the declining safety of public transport,

Acknowledging the amount of work that has been done considering green transportation,

Environmental Management

1. Encourages governments to support and invest in green technology such as a solar wind and carbon recapture; Legislation and Restrictions
2. Recommends government institutes tax cuts for corporations that consistently meet a higher Standard of sustainability;
3. Encourage the reform of laws that reduce high emissions and waste
4. Directs countries and their companies to improve waste management so trash and toxins do not end up in our environment;

5. Endorses companies to reduce waste production and promote the repurposing of wasted or unused materials;

6. Invites NGOs to promote the use of sustainable energy for a healthier environment;
7. Deplores member states to take action on preventing pollution or using environmentally friendly transportation;
8. Calls upon member states to prevent over exploitation and environmental damage through creating laws and legislation that affect corporations;
9. Draws the attention to people on the effects of pollution in the environment;
10. Supports and urges civilians to use self-powered transportation when possible;
11. Further proclaims the importance of water management systems to achieve resource efficiency and to prevent water scarcity;

13. Calls upon member states to support all using renewable and sustainable energy.
