#### **Topic: Water scarcity in agriculture**

#### **Nature effects**

1. Calls upon emergency irrigation systems and declaring better preparation for natural disasters;
2. Also calls for emergency water supplies in case of drought;
3. Authorizes government funds to be redirected to maintain and improve ecosystems;
4. Encourages countries not to let sewer water cause pollution in other bodies of water;
5. Further invites investments in weather tracking technology;
6. Draws the attention to climate change;

### **Educating to prevent water scarcity**

7. Supports programs that educate people on water scarcity;
8. Accepts that proper education on water scarcity for all is a possibility;
9. Requests the founding of a sub-committee that educates on water scarcity;
10. Calls for properly educated farmers;
11. Encourages schools to have programs that educate children on water scarcity;
12. Endorses the idea of working to save water scarcity;
13. Trusts member states to provide education on water scarcity;
14. Expresses its appreciation towards educated farmers;

### **Harvesting and saving water**

15. Encourages to change leaky water systems;
16. Urges countries to pay attention to the amount of water being used;
17. Strongly encourages the UN to abort a resolution calling for harvesting water;
18. Further invites countries to treat water with more respect;
19. Calls upon countries to filter polluted water;
20. Encourages countries to make good use of grey water;

### **Water use in technology**

21. Requests more investment in water infrastructure;
22. Urges government to install water filters in our water systems;
23. Recommends the higher use of water management systems;
24. Encourages countries to donate water to developing nearby countries;
25. Invites countries to further explore the issue of water scarcity;
26. Calls upon member states to donate water pumps to dry areas;
27. Suggests the further use of eco friendly machinery if needed;
28. Congratulates countries who use their water responsibly.
