Topic: Engaging boys and young men in gender equality

Emphasizing that barriers and stereotypes are a problem,

Taking into deep concern that women are being pushed back by unfair assumptions,

Alarmed by the amount of gender inequality increasing in the world,

Recognizing that young men and boys contribute to the problem of gender inequality,

Encouraging women and men to reject the barriers,

Alarmed by the fact that certain women would not report that they were victims of gender based violence.

Acknowledging that women are being discouraged from participating in political activities,

Alarmed by the fact that despite our efforts against it, women are still being mistreated,

Believing that a majority of men and young boys all over the world believe that gender equality is not important,

Alarmed by the fact that woman all over the world are being abused in many ways,

Reject barriers and stereotypes and involving all countries to cooperate

1. Advises that programs are created for people to understand the effects of stereotypes;

- 2. Calls upon all countries to help achieve gender equality;
- 3. Also calls for all countries to reject the barriers direct to gender inequality;
- 4. Recognize that we cannot achieve gender equality with harsh statements;
- 5. Encourages women to learn how to conquer stereotypes;

Education and boys' and young mens' contribution to helping women

- 6. Advises that young men go to programs to understand how biased assumptions and statements affect woman;
- 1. Acknowledge that all countries should work together to stop gender inequality;
- 2. Urges for the expanding of children and youth programs;
- 3. Encourages boys and young men to spread word about gender inequality and how to help solve it;
- 4. Recommends nations to give a better education, expand the Youth program, and to further encourage gender equality;
- 5. Requests gender equality talks during school;

Helping women achieve gender equality without violence

- 6. Reminds us to treat women equally;
- 7. Encourage equal education for all genders;
- 8. Request boys and men to share that we should have gender equality;
- 9. Strongly encourage women to run for position of power;
- 10. Supports changing the common misconception about women;
- 11. Urge countries to come together to support gender equality;
- 12. Reminds women not to step down, but step up;
- 13. Accepts that women need help achieving gender equality without violence;

Women being allowed in positions of power and gender equality in all places

- 14. Take note of the fact that helping women and young girls could achieve gender equality;
- 15. Directs the people to a better society without violence toward women;
- 16. Acknowledges that women need to be heard;
- 17. Directs the community to empower women through the situation they are currently in until there is gender equality.
