Topic: Pandemic preparedness and response

Deeply concerned by quick spreading diseases and infections,

Expressing concern of the fact that test results don't come back as soon as they need to,

Realizing that not all countries have the technology for early pandemic warning notification systems,

Emphasizing the need for preparedness for future pandemic,

Acknowledging for accurate, easily accessible healthcare information, to prepare for future pandemics,

Alarmed that countries don't have enough money for medical equipment,

Taking note of the fact that pandemics can be sudden and spread rapidly without anyone ever knowing,

Noting that some countries don't have enough doctors and nurses ready for potential pandemics,

Rapid response teams

1. Encourages WHO to support a global agreement that empowers them to order vaccine mandates;
2. Advises emergency medical kits commonly distributed by the WHO from donations to the UN;
3. Suggests stronger and faster rapid response teams by investing in first responders to pandemics;
4. Calls for better communications and proposes a program for doctors that helps distribute vaccines and formulas;

Health information and early warning systems

5. Calls upon more clinical checkups to recognize viruses early on;
6. Encourages that most public establishments display information about important health data in their area;
7. Requests websites and local newspapers on public health status and coming pandemics;
8. Encourages the government to survey the public about their health status;

Distributing necessary supplies

9. Requests cooperation and communication between nations in order to prepare for pandemics and epidemics world-wide;
10. Encourages the use of sanitary supplies to prevent future pandemic outbreaks;
11. Emphasizes the urgent need for better distribution of necessary medical supplies;

Raising awareness about pandemics

12. Calls for member states to hold events for pandemic preparedness;
13. Requests that countries have set aside a fund for sudden epidemics.
