Topic: Universal health coverage

Aware of hospitals around the world being destroyed by war,

Seeking the military to protect hospitals,

Stressing that hospitals around the world lack secure disease protection,

Recognizing that countries make it harder to have good access and rights to healthcare,

Seeking adequate drinking water and living conditions,

Noting with deep concern that the lack of disease prevention for citizens is an issue,

Alarmed by how many people struggle to afford healthcare,

Expecting the spread of health services,

Noting with deep concern that hospitals have been attacked, including by terrorists,

Noting the need to improve healthcare services globally,

Safety of Hospitals

1. Trusts that local hospitals make sure that patients are well cared for;
2. Demands that we expand the areas where hospitals are found;
3. Requests that people are safe in hospitals;
4. Endorses the hiring of more doctors and nurses;
5. Calls for safer protection of patients in dangerous areas;
6. Urges the use of modern technology to stop future diseases;

Rights and Access to Healthcare

7. Encourages people to build more health care centers;
8. Accepts free medical services for citizens;
9. Encourage countries to cooperate in health care programs;

10. Accepts that good health care is hard to achieve;
11. Recommends more medical schools to be built;
12. Emphasizes the issue of low quality water and recommends water filters, including clay pot filters and other such materials;

Cooperation for Healthcare

13. Notes the need to improve healthcare services around the world;
14. Has resolved that people need to put more money into healthcare;
15. Considers countries to use tax funds for better healthcare;
16. Supports the idea of international cooperation;
17. Notes that healthcare should be free under specific circumstances;

Services and Safety of Healthcare

18. Recommends that wealthier countries donate more money for the 2030 deadline for Sustainable Development Goals;
19. Acknowledges that health services need to provide studies on natural medicine;
20. Notes with satisfaction that countries are putting more money into healthcare services.
